

Do not repair or replace any part of the product unless specified expressly in the user manual.

Do not perform any modifications on the product.

### **A**1.1 Purpose of usage

- This product is not intended for commercial use and it shall not be used out of its intended purpose.
   This product is intended for operating interiors, such as households or similar.
   For example;
- In the staff kitchens of the stores, offices and other working environments,
  - In farm houses.
- In the units of hotels, motels or other resting facilities that are used by the customers,
- In hostels, or similar environments,
- In catering services and similar non-retail applications.

This product shall not be used in open or enclosed external environments such as vessels, balconies or terraces. Exposing the product to rain, snow, sunlight and wind may cause risk of fire.

## ▲1.2 Safety of children, vulnerable persons and pets

- This product may be used by children aged 8 years and older and persons with underdeveloped physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a the product safe way and the hazards involved.
- Children between 3 and 8 years are allowed to put and take out food to/ from the cooler product.
- Electrical products are dangerous for children and pets. Children and pets must not play with, climb on, or enter the product.
- Cleaning and user maintenance should not be performed by children unless there is someone overseeing them.
- Keep the packaging materials away from children. Risk of injury and suffocation.
- Before disposing of old products that shall not be used any more:
- **1.** Unplug the power cord from the mains socket.
- **2.** Cut the power cord and remove it from the appliance together with the plug.
- **3.** Do not remove the racks and drawers from the product to prevent children from getting inside the appliance.
- 4. Remove the doors.
- **5.** Store the product so that it shall not be tipped over.
- **6.** Do not allow children to play with the scrapped product.

- Do not dispose of the product by throwing it into fire. Risk of explosion.
- If there is a lock available in the product's door, keep the key out of children's reach.

### **▲**1.3 Electrical safety

- The product shall not be plugged into the outlet during installation, maintenance, cleaning, repair, and transportation operations.
- If the power the cord is damaged, it shall be replaced by authorized service only to avoid any risk that may occur.
- Do not tuck the power cord under the product or to the rear of the product.
   Do not put heavy items on the power cord. The power cord should not be bent, crushed, and come into contact with any heat source.
- Do not use an extension cord, multiplug or adaptor to operate your product.
- Portable multi sockets or portable power supplies may overheat and cause fire. Thus, do not have a multiplug behind or in the vicinity of the product.
- The plug shall be easily accessible.
   If this is not possible, a mechanism that meets the electrical legislation and that disconnects all terminals from the mains (fuse, switch, main switch, etc.) shall be available on the electrical installation.
- Do not touch the plug with wet hands.
- When unplugging the appliance, don't hold the power cord, but the plug.

### **▲**1.4 Handling Safety

- This product is heavy, do not handle it by yourself.
- Do not hold the product from its door while handling the product.
- Be careful not to damage the cooling system and the pipes while handling the product. Do not operate the product if the pipes are damaged, and contact an authorized service.

## **▲**1.5 Installation Safety

- Contact the Authorized Service for the product's installation. To prepare the product for installation, see the information in the user guide and make sure the electric and water utilities are as required. If the installation is not suitable, call a qualified electrician and plumber to have them make the necessary arrangements. Otherwise, electric shock, fire, issues with the product or injuries may occur.
- Check for any damage on the product before installing it. Do not have the product installed if it is damaged.
- Place the product on a level and hard surface and balance with the adjustable legs. Otherwise, the refrigerator may tip over and cause injuries.
- The product shall be installed in a dry and ventilated environment.
   Do not keep carpets, rugs or similar floor covers under the product. This may cause risk of fire as a result of inadequate ventilation!
- Do not block or cover ventilation holes. Otherwise, power consumption may be increased and damage to your product may occur.
- Do not connect the product to supply systems such as solar power supplies.

- Otherwise, damage to your product may occur as a result of the abrupt voltage fluctuations!
- The more refrigerant a refrigerator contains, the bigger its installation room shall be. In very small rooms, a flammable gas-air mixture may occur in case of a gas leak in the cooling system. At least 1 m³ of volume is required for each 8 grams of refrigerant. The amount of the refrigerant available in your product is specified in the Type Label.
- The installation place of the product shall not be exposed to direct sunlight and it shall not be in the vicinity of a heat source such as stoves, radiators, etc.

If you cannot prevent installation of the product in the vicinity of a heat source, you shall use a suitable insulation plate and the minimum distance to the heat source shall be as specified below.

- At least 30 cm away from heat sources such as stoves, heating units and heaters, etc.,
- And at least 5 cm away from electric ovens.
- Your product has the protection class of I. Plug the product in a grounded socket that conforms with the Voltage, Current and Frequency values specified in the type label. The socket outlet shall be equipped with a fuse with a rating of 10 A - 16 A. Our company shall not be responsible for the damages that shall be incurred as a result of operating the product without ensuring ground and electrical connections made as per local or national regulations.

- The product's power cable must be unplugged during installation.
   Otherwise, risk of electric shock and injury may occur!
- Do not plug the product to loose, broken, dirty, greasy sockets or sockets that has come out their seats or sockets with a risk of water contact.
- Place the power cord and hoses (if available) of the product so that they shall not cause a risk of tripping over.
- Penetration of humidity to live parts or to the power cord may cause short circuit. Thus, do not use the product in humid environments or in areas where water may splash (e.g. garage, laundry room, etc.) If the refrigerator is wet by water, unplug it and contact an authorized service.
- Do not connect your refrigerator to power saving devices. These systems are harmful for the product.

### ▲1.6 Operational safety

- Do not use chemical solvents on the product. These materials contain an explosion risk.
- In case of a failure of the product, unplug it and do not operate until it is repaired by the authorized service. There is a risk of electric shock!
- Do not place a source of flame (e.g. candles, cigarettes, etc.) on the product or in the vicinity of it.
- Do not get on the product. Risk of falling and injury!
- Do not cause damage to the pipes of the cooling system using sharp and piercing tools. The refrigerant that sprays out in case of puncturing the gas pipes, pipe extensions or upper surface coatings may cause irritation of skin and injuries of the eyes.
- Do not place and operate electric appliances inside the refrigerators/deep freezer unless it is advised by the manufacturer.

- Do not jam any parts of your hands or your body to the moving parts inside the product. Be careful to prevent jamming of your fingers between the refrigerator and its door. Be careful while opening or closing the door if there are children around.
- Do not put ice cream, ice cubes or frozen food to your mouth as soon as you take them out of the freezer. Risk of frostbite!
- Do not touch the inner walls, metal parts of the freezer or food kept inside the refrigerator with wet hands. Risk of frostbite!
- Do not place soda cans or cans and bottles that contain fluids that may be frozen to the freezer compartment. Cans or bottles may explode. Risk of injury and material damage!
- Do not use or place materials sensitive against temperature such as flammable sprays, flammable objects, dry ice or other chemical agents in the vicinity of the refrigerator. Risk of fire and explosion!
- Do not store explosive materials such as aerosol cans with flammable materials inside the product.
- Do not place cans containing fluids over the product. Splashing of water on an electrical part may cause the risk of an electric shock or a fire.
- This product is not intended for storage and cooling of medicines, blood plasma, laboratory preparations or similar materials and products that are subject to the Medical Products Directive.

- If the product is used against its intended purpose, it may cause damage to or deterioration of the products kept inside.
- If your refrigerator is equipped with blue light, do not look at this light with optical devices. Do not stare directly at UV LED light for a long time. Ultraviolet rays may cause eye strain.
- Do not fill the product with more food than its capacity. Injuries or damages may occur if the contents of the refrigerator falls when the door is opened. Similar problems may occur when an object is placed over the product.
- Ensure that you have removed any ice or water that may have fallen to the floor to prevent injuries.
- Change the locations of the racks/ bottle racks on the door of your refrigerator while the racks are empty only. Danger of physical injury!
- Do not place objects that may fall/ tipped over on the product. These objects may fall while opening or closing the door and cause injuries and/or material damages.
- Do not hit or exert excessive pressure on glass surfaces. Broken glass may cause injuries and/or material damages.
  - The cooling system in your product contains R600a refrigerant. The refrigerant type used in the product is specified in the the type label. This gas is flammable. Therefore, be careful not to damage the cooling system and the pipes while operating the product. In case of damage to the pipes;
- do not touch the product or the power cord,

- Keep the product away from potential sources of fire that may cause the product to catch fire.
- ventilation the area where the product is placed. Do not use a fan.
  - Contact authorized service.
- If the product is damaged and you observe gas leak, please stay away from the gas. Gas may cause frostbite if it contacts your skin.

## **1.7** Maintenance and cleaning safety

- Do not pull by the door handle if you shall move the product for cleaning purposes. Handle may cause injuries if it is pulled too hard.
- Do not clean the product by spraying or pouring water on the product and inside the product. Risk of electric shock and fire.
- Do not use sharp or abrasive tools to clean the product. Do not use materials such as household cleaning agents, detergents, gas, gasoline, alcohol, wax, etc.
- Use cleaning and maintenance agents that are not harmful for food only inside the product.
- Do not use steam or steamed cleaning materials for cleaning the product and thawing the ice inside it.
   Steam contacts the live areas in your refrigerator and causes short circuit or electric shock!
- Take care to keep water away from the electronic circuits or lighting of the product.
- Use a clean, dry cloth to wipe the dust or foreign material on the tips of the

plugs. Do not use a wet or damp piece of cloth to clean the plug. Otherwise, risk of fire or electric shock may occur.

### **▲**1.8HomeWhiz



# 4.1.Points to be paid attention to when the relocation of the refrigerator

- **1.** Your refrigerator should be unplugged. Before transportation of your refrigerator, it should be emptied and cleaned.
- **2.** Before it is re-packaged, shelves, accessories, crisper, etc. inside your refrigerator should be fixed with adhesive tape and secured against impacts. Package should be bound with a thick tape or sound ropes and the transportation rules on the package should be strictly observed.
- **3.** Original packaging and foam materials should be kept for future transportations or moving.

Before you start the refrigerator, Check the following before you start to use your refrigerator:

- **1.** Clean the interior of the refrigerator as recommended in the "Maintenance and cleaning" section.
- **2.** Connect the plug of the refrigerator to the wall socket. When the fridge door is opened, fridge internal lamp will turn on.
- **3.** When the compressor starts to operate, a sound will be heard. The liquid and gases sealed within the refrigeration system may also give rise to noise, even if the compressor is not running and this is quite normal.

**4.** Front edges of the refrigerator may feel warm. This is normal. These areas are designed to be warm to avoid condensation.

#### 4.2. Electrical connection

Connect your product to a grounded socket which is being protected by a fuse with the appropriate capacity. Important:

The connection must be in compliance with national regulations.

- The power plug must be easily accessible after installation.
- Electrical safety of your refrigerator shall be guaranteed only if the earth system in your house complies with standards.
- The voltage stated on the label located at left inner side of your product should be equal to your network voltage.
- Extension cables and multi plugs must not be used for connection.

A damaged power cable must be replaced by a qualified electrician.

Product must not be operated before it is repaired! There is the risk of electric shock!

## 4.3. Disposing of the packaging

The packing materials may be dangerous for children. Keep the packing materials out of the reach of children or dispose of them by classifying them in accordance with the waste instructions stated by your local authorities. Do not throw away with regular house waste, throw away on packaging pick up spots designated by the local authorities.

The packing of your refrigerator is produced from recyclable materials.

## 4.4.Disposing of your old refrigerator

Dispose of your old refrigerator without giving any harm to the environment.

 You may consult your authorized dealer or waste collection center of your municipality about the disposal of your refrigerator.

Before disposing of your refrigerator, cut off the electric plug and, if there are any locks on the door, make them inoperable in order to protect children against any danger.

#### 4.5. Placing and Installation

A If the entrance door of the room where the refrigerator will be installed is not wide enough for the refrigerator to pass through, then carefully remove the doors of your refrigerator and pass it sideways through the door.

- **1.** Install your refrigerator to a place that allows ease of use.
- **2.** Keep your refrigerator away from heat sources, humid places and direct sunlight.

- **3.** There must be appropriate air ventilation around your refrigerator in order to achieve an efficient operation. If the refrigerator is to be placed in a recess in the wall, there must be at least 5 cm distance with the ceiling and at least 5 cm with the wall. Do not place your product on the materials such as rug or carpet.
- **4.** Place your refrigerator on an even floor surface to prevent jolts.
- **5.** This product cannot be used in rooms where the temperature drops below 5°C.
- **6.** Your product requires adequate air circulation to function efficiently. If the product will be placed in an alcove, remember to leave at least 5 cm clearance between the product and the ceiling, rear wall and the side walls. If the product will be placed in an alcove, remember to leave at least 5 cm clearance between the product and the ceiling, rear wall and the side walls. Check if the rear wall clearance protection component is present at its location (if provided with the product). If the component is not available, or if it is lost or fallen, position the product so that at least 5 cm clearance shall be left between the rear surface of the product and the wall of the room. The clearance at the rear is important for efficient operation of the product.

#### WARNING:

Do not locate extension sockets or charging transformers/power supplies or Lithium-Iron battery operated products adjacent to the compressor as they could overheat.

Read the "Safety Instructions" section

- Your refrigerator should be installed at least 30 cm away from heat sources such as hobs, ovens, central heater and stoves and at least 5 cm away from electrical ovens and should not be located under direct sunlight.
- The ambient temperature of the room where you install your refrigerator should at least be -5°C. Operating your refrigerator under cooler conditions is not recommended with regard to its efficiency.
- Please make sure that the interior of your refrigerator is cleaned thoroughly.
- If two refrigerators are to be installed side by side, there should be at least 2 cm distance between them.
- When you operate your refrigerator for the first time, please observe the following instructions during the initial six hours.
- The door should not be opened frequently.
- It must be operated empty without any food in it.
- Do not unplug your refrigerator. If a power failure occurs out of your control, please see the warnings in the "Recommended solutions for the problems" section.
- Original packaging and foam materials should be kept for future transportations or moving.
- The baskets/drawers that are provided with the chill compartment must always be in use for low energy consumption and for better storage conditions.

- Food contact with the temperature sensor in the freezer compartment may increase energy consumption of the appliance. Thus any contact with the sensor(s) must be avoided.
- In some models, the instrument panel automatically turns off 5 minutes after the door has closed. It will be reactivated when the door has opened or pressed on any key.
- Due to temperature change as a result of opening/closing the product door during operation, condensation on the door/body shelves and the glass containers is normal

#### **Preparation**

#### **Hints and Tips**

#### Hints for energy saving

- Most efficient use of energy is ensured in the configuration with the drawers in the bottom part of the appliance and shelves evenly distributed. Position of the door bins does not affect energy consumption.
- Do not open the door frequently or leave it open longer than necessary.
- Do not set too high temperature to save energy unless it is required by the characteristics of the food.
- If the ambient temperature is high and the temperature control is set to low temperature and the appliance is fully loaded, the compressor may run continuously, causing frost or ice formation on the evaporator. In this case, set the temperature control toward higher temperature to allow automatic defrosting and to save energy this way.
- Ensure a good ventilation. Do not cover the ventilation grilles or holes.

#### Hints for fresh food refrigeration

- Good temperature setting that ensures preservation of fresh food is a temperature less than or equal to +4°C.
- Higher temperature setting inside the appliance may lead to shorter shelf life of food.
- Cover the food with packaging to preserve its freshness and aroma.
- Always use closed containers for liquids and for food, to avoid flavours or odours in the compartment.

- To avoid the cross-contamination between cooked and raw food, cover the cooked food and separate it from the raw one.
- It is recommended to defrost the food inside the fridge.
- Do not insert hot food inside the appliance. Make sure it has cooled down at room temperature before inserting it.
- To prevent food waste the new stock of food should always be placed behind the old one.

#### Hints for food refrigeration


 Meat (all types): wrap in a suitable packaging and place it on the glass shelf above the vegetable drawer. Store meat for at most 1 -2 days.

#### Operating the product

#### 1.Wireless Key

This Key is used to make a wireless connection with your product via HomeWhiz mobile app. ( )

When the Key is pressed for a long period (3 seconds), the LED on the key flashes slowly (with intervals of 0.5 seconds). The home network is initialized on the product this way.

After achieving wireless connection with the product, the LED on the key illuminates continuously.

When the initial connection is established, you may activate/deactivate the connection with a short press on this key. Until the connection is established, the LED on the key

blinks quickly (with the interval of 0.2 seconds). When the connection is active, the LED shall light up continuously.

If the connection cannot be established for a long period, check your connection settings and refer to the "Troubleshooting" section provided in the user manual.

#### 2. Vacation Function Key:

Press the key for 3 seconds to activate the vacation function. Vacation mode is activated and the vacation symbol (\$\mathbb{D}\$) is illuminated. "--" shall be displayed on the Cooling Compartment temperature indicator and the cooling compartment does not actively perform cooling. You shall not keep your food in the cooling compartment when this function is activated. The other compartments continue to cool according to the set temperatures. Press the key for 3 seconds again to cancel this function.

## 3. Cooling Compartment Temperature Setting Key:

Allows setting of temperature for cooler compartment. Pressing this key will enable the cooling compartment temperature to be set at 8,7,6,5,4,3,2 and 1 °C.

#### 4. Cooling Compartment Symbol:

The temperature values of the cooling compartment is displayed on the screen when this symbol is active.

#### 5. Freezing Compartment Symbol:

The temperature values of the freezing compartment is displayed on the screen when this symbol is active.

## 6. Freezing Compartment Temperature Setting Key:

Temperature setting is made for cooler compartment. Pressing this key will enable the freezer compartment temperature to be set at -18,-19,-20,-21,-22,-23,-24 °C.

#### 7. Quick Freezing Key:

When the quick freeze key is pressed, the quick freeze symbol ( ) shall be illuminated and the quick freeze function shall be activated. Freezing compartment temperature is set to -27 Celcius. Function is cancelled when the key is pressed again. The quick freezing function shall be automatically cancelled after 24 hours. To freeze a large amount of fresh food, press the quick freeze key before placing the food in the freezer compartment.

#### 8. Fault Condition Indicator:

This indicator (1) shall be active when your refrigerator cannot perform adequate cooling or in case of any sensor error. "E" shall be displayed on the Freezing Compartment temperature indicator and figures such as 1,2,3... shall be displayed on the cooling compartment temperature indicator. These figures provide information to the authorized

service on the error that has occurred. Exclamation mark may be displayed when you load warm food to the freezing compartment or keep the door open for a long period of time. This is not a fault, this warning shall be removed when the food is cooled down or when any key is pressed.

#### 9.0n/Off Function:


This function ( ) allows you to make the Fridge turn off when pressed for 3 seconds. The fridge could be turned on by pressing On/Off button for 3 seconds again . When the function is active, all indicators turn off.

#### Operating the product

## **6.1 Defrosting**A) Fridge Compartment

The fridae compartment defrosts automatically. The defrosting water runs to the drain tube via a collection. container at the back of the appliance (1). (see diagram) During defrosting water droplets may form at the back of the fridge compartment where concealed evaporator is located. Some droplets may remain on the liner and refreeze when defrosting is completed. Do not allow items in the fridge to touch the back wall as the water droplets will make them wet. Do not use pointed or sharp edged objects such as knives, forks to remove the droplets which have frozen.

If at any time the defrost water does not drain from the collection channel, check to ensure that no food particles have blocked the drain tube. The drain tube can be cleared by pushing the special plastic plunger provided down the drain tube (2). If the frost layer reaches about 1/4"(7 mm), reduce the setting (i.e. from 4 to 1) to restart automatic defrosting.



#### B) Freezer compartment

Defrosting is very straightforward and without mess, thanks to a special defrost collection basin.

Defrost twice a year or when a frost layer of around 7 (1/4") mm has formed. To start the defrosting procedure, switch off the appliance at the socket outlet and pull out the mains plug.

All food should be wrapped in several layers of newspaper and stored in a cool place (e.g. fridge or larder).

Containers of warm water may be placed carefully in the freezer to speed up the defrosting.

Do not use pointed or sharp-edged objects, such as knives or forks to remove the frost.

Never use hairdryers, electrical heaters or other such electrical appliances for defrosting.

Sponge out the defrost water collected in the bottom of the freezer compartment. After defrosting, dry the interior thoroughly.

Insert the plug into the wall socket and switch on the electricity supply.

#### Operating the product

#### 6.2 Placing the food

Egg tray	Egg
Fridge compartment shelves	Food in pans, covered plates and closed containers
Fridge compartment doorshelves	Small and packaged food or drinks (such as milk, fruit juice and beer)
Crisper	Vegetables and fruits

Depending on the tallness of bottles that are put to the bottle shelf, bottles can be in the position to touch the door rack. In this case, you can change the position of bottle shelf so that it does not touch the door rack.

## 6.3 Changing the illumination lamp

To change the Bulb/LED used for illumination of your refrigerator, call your AuthorisedService.

The lamp(s) used in this appliance is not suitable for household room illumination. The intended purpose of this lamp is to assist the user to place foodstuffs in the refrigerator/freezer in a safe and comfortable way.

The lamps used in this appliance have to withstand extreme physical conditions such as temperatures below -20 °C. (only chest and upright freezer)

## 7 Maintenance and cleaning

Read the "Safety Instructions" section first!

Never use gasoline, benzene or similar substances for cleaning purposes.

We recommend that you unplug the appliance before cleaning.

Never use any sharp abrasive instrument, soap, household cleaner, detergent and wax polish for cleaning.

For non-No Frost products, water drops and frosting up to a fingerbreadth occur on the rear wall of the Fridge compartment. Do not clean it; never apply oil or similar agents on it.

Only use slightly damp microfiber cloths to clean the outer surface of the product. Sponges and other types of cleaning cloths may scratch the surface.

- Use lukewarm water to clean the cabinet of your refrigerator and wipe it dry.
- Use a damp cloth wrung out in a solution of one teaspoon of bicarbonate of soda to one pint of water to clean the interior and wipe it dry.

Make sure that no water enters the lamp housing and other electrical items.

If your refrigerator is not going to be used for a long period of time, unplug the power cable, remove all food, clean it and leave the door ajar.

Check door seals regularly to ensure they are clean and free from food particles.

To remove door racks, remove all the contents and then simply push the door rack upwards from the base.

Never use cleaning agents or water that contain chlorine to clean the outer surfaces and chromium coated parts of the product. Chlorine causes corrosion on such metal surfaces.

⚠ Do not use sharp, abrasive tools, soap, household cleaning agents, detergents, kerosene, fuel oil, varnish etc. to prevent removal and deformation of the prints on the plastic part. Use lukewarm water and a soft cloth for cleaning and then wipe it dry.

#### **Protection of plastic surfaces**

Do not put the liquid oils or oil-cooked meals in your refrigerator in unsealed containers as they damage the plastic surfaces of your refrigerator. In case of spilling or smearing oil on the plastic surfaces, clean and rinse the relevant part of the surface at once with warm water.

## 8 Troubleshooting

Please review this list before calling the service. It will save your time and money. This list includes frequent complaints that are not arising from defective workmanship or material usage. Some of the features described here may not exist in your product.

#### The refrigerator does not operate.

- The plug is not inserted into the socket correctly. >> Insert the plug into the socket securely.
- The fuse of the socket which your refrigerator is connected to or the main fuse have blown out, >>> Check the fuse.

Condensation on the side wall of the fridge compartment (MULTIZONE, COOL CONTROL and FLEXI ZONE).

- Door has been opened frequently.
   >> Do not open and close the door of refrigerator frequently.
- Ambient is very humid. >>> Do not install your refrigerator into highly humid places.
- Food containing liquid is stored in open containers. >>> Do not store food with liquid content in open containers.
- Door of the refrigerator is left ajar.
   >> Close the door of the refrigerator.
- Thermostat is set to a very cold level.
   >> Set the thermostat to a suitable level.

#### Compressor is not running

- Protective thermic of the compressor will blow out during sudden power failures or plug-out plug-ins as the refrigerant pressure in the cooling system of the refrigerator has not been balanced yet. The refrigerator will start running approximately after 6 minutes. Please call the service if the refrigerator does not startup at the end of this period.
  - The fridge is in defrost cycle. >>> This is normal for a full-automatically defrosting refrigerator. Defrosting cycle occurs periodically.
- The refrigerator is not plugged into the socket. >> > Make sure that the plug is fit into the socket.
- Temperature settings are not made correctly. >> Select the suitable temperature value.
- There is a power outage. >>> Refrigerator returns to normal operation when the power restores.

The operation noise increases when the refrigerator is running.

• The operating performance of the refrigerator may change due to the changes in the ambient temperature. It is normal and not a fault.

The refrigerator is running frequently or for a long time.

#### **Troubleshooting**

- New product may be wider than the previous one. Larger refrigerators operate for a longer period of time.
- The room temperature may be high.
   >> It is normal that the product operates for longer periods in hot ambient.
- The refrigerator might be plugged in recently or might be loaded with food.
   >> When the refrigerator is plugged in or loaded with food recently, it will take longer for it to attain the set temperature. This is normal.
- Large amounts of hot food might be put in the refrigerator recently. >>> Do not put hot food into the refrigerator.
- Doors might be opened frequently or left ajar for a long time. >>> The warm air that has entered into the refrigerator causes the refrigerator to run for longer periods. Do not open the doors frequently.
- Freezer or fridge compartment door might be left ajar. >>> Check if the doors are closed completely.
- The refrigerator is adjusted to a very low temperature. >>> Adjust the refrigerator temperature to a warmer degree and wait until the temperature is achieved.
- Door seal of the fridge or freezer may be soiled, worn out, broken or not properly seated. >>> Clean or replace the seal.
   Damaged/broken seal causes the refrigerator to run for a longer period of time in order to maintain the current temperature.

## Freezer temperature is very low while the fridge temperature is sufficient.

 The freezer temperature is adjusted to a very low value. > > Adjust the freezer temperature to a warmer degree and check.

## Fridge temperature is very low while the freezer temperature is sufficient.

 The fridge temperature is adjusted to a very low value. >>> Adjust the fridge temperature to a warmer degree and check.

## Food kept in the fridge compartment drawers is frozen.

 The fridge temperature is adjusted to a very high value. > > > Adjust the fridge temperature to a lower value and check.

## Temperature in the fridge or freezer is very low.

- The fridge temperature is adjusted to a very high value. >>> Fridge compartment temperature setting has an effect on the temperature of the freezer. Change the temperatures of the fridge or freezer and wait until the relevant compartments attain a sufficient temperature.
- Doors are opened frequently or left ajar for a long time. >>> Do not open the doors frequently.
- Door is ajar. >>> Close the door completely.
- The refrigerator is plugged in or loaded with food recently. >>> This is normal.
   When the refrigerator is plugged in or loaded with food recently, it will take longer for it to attain the set temperature.
- Large amounts of hot food might be put in the refrigerator recently. >>> Do not put hot food into the refrigerator.
- Vibrations or noise.
- The floor is not level or stable. >>> If the refrigerator rocks when moved slowly, balance it by adjusting its feet. Also make sure that the floor is strong enough to carry the refrigerator, and level.
- The items put onto the refrigerator may cause noise. >>> Remove the items on top of the refrigerator.

#### **Troubleshooting**

## There are noises coming from the refrigerator like liquid flowing, spraying, etc.

• Liquid and gas flows occur in accordance with the operating principles of your refrigerator. It is normal and not a fault.

#### Whistle comes from the refrigerator.

Fans are used in order to cool the refrigerator. It is normal and not a fault.

## Condensation on the inner walls of refrigerator.

- Hot and humid weather increases icing and condensation. It is normal and not a fault.
- Doors are opened frequently or left ajar for a long time. >>> Do not open the doors frequently. Close them if they are open.
- Door is ajar. >>> Close the door completely.

## Humidity occurs on the outside of the refrigerator or between the doors.

 There might be humidity in the air; this is quite normal in humid weather. When the humidity is less, condensation will disappear.

#### Bad odour inside the refrigerator.

- No regular cleaning is performed.
   >> Clean the inside of the refrigerator regularly with a sponge, lukewarm water or carbonate dissolved in water.
- Some containers or package materials may cause the smell. >>> Use a different container or different brand packaging material.
- Food is put into the refrigerator in uncovered containers. > > Keep the food in closed containers. Microorganisms spreading out from uncovered containers can cause unpleasant odours.
- Remove the foods that have expired best before dates and spoiled from the refrigerator.

#### The door is not closing.

- Food packages are preventing the door from closing. >>> Replace the packages that are obstructing the door.
- The refrigerator is not completely even on the floor. >>> Adjust the feet to balance the refrigerator.
- The floor is not level or strong. >>> Make sure that the floor is level and capable to carry the refrigerator.

#### Crispers are stuck.

 The food is touching the ceiling of the drawer. >> > Rearrange food in the drawer.

#### If The Surface Of The Product Is Hot.

 High temperatures may be observed between the two doors, on the side panels and at the rear grill while the product is operating. This is normal and does not require service maintenance!

#### **TECHNICAL DATA**

The technical information is situated in the rating plate on the internal side of the appliance and on the energy label.

The QR code on the energy label supplied with the appliance provides a web link to the information related to the performance of the appliance in the EU EPREL database. Keep the energy label for reference together with the user manual and all other documents provided with this appliance.
